Construction Activities

Construction is gearing up along this 3.8 mile section of the State Highway Administration's (SHA) Intercounty Connector (ICC). This section of the ICC stretches from just west of US 29 (Columbia Pike) to just east of I-95 and is more than 25 percent complete.

Currently, there is a lot of bridge work being done in the area. A new bridge that will take Old Columbia Pike over the ICC is underway and is expected to be opened to the public in fall 2009. Bridge work is also going on in the medians of US 29 and I-95. As work on the bridges continues, please stay alert for occasional lane closures and temporary traffic delays. SHA urges motorists to be attentive, reduce speeds, and watch for work zone flaggers and construction messages.

Other activities you can expect to see this spring include:

- ◆ Tree clearing east of Briggs Chaney Road
- ◆ Continuing establishment of erosion and sediment controls
- ◆ Installing storm drain structures
- ◆ Earth moving and road grading
- ◆ Relocating public utilities
- ◆ Continuing bridge construction activities

While some evening (7-10 p.m.) work may be occasionally necessary over the next three months, there are no plans for overnight (10 p.m.- 7a.m.) work. Whenever evening or overnight work becomes necessary, the ICC team will notify affected residents by placing a flier on the doors of homes at least 48 hours in advance of the work.



Coming Soon... Sound Barrier Meetings

The ICC team is completing sound analyses for four specific areas along the project corridor – Tanglewood, Greencastle, Cross Creek and the Briggs Chaney Road area. In the coming months, the ICC project team will host sound barrier informational meetings for property owners where sound barriers are planned. Individual meetings will be held for each community. The meetings will provide information on the length and the height of the barrier, proximity to individual property lines, planned landscaping and construction schedule. ICC staff will be available to answer questions and address any concerns or issues from residents.

Once the sound barrier meetings are scheduled, we will notify residents through their homeowners association or with mailings about the dates, times, and locations.
